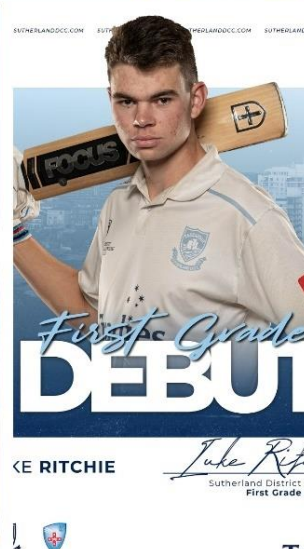
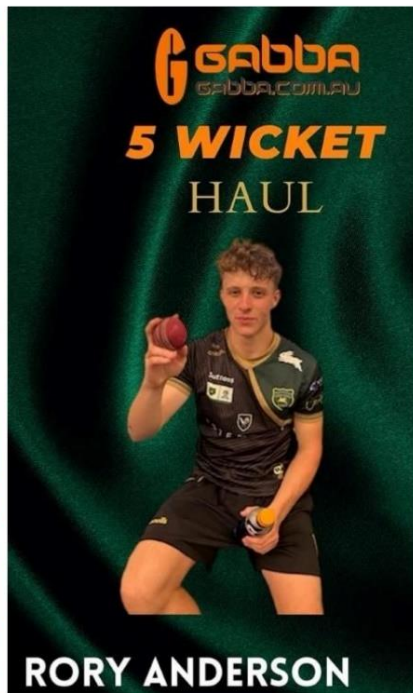

PRESIDENTS REPORT

As we close another memorable season at the Engadine Dragons Cricket Club, I am filled with immense pride and gratitude towards everyone who has contributed to our club's successes and challenges throughout the 2023-24 season. Reflecting on our journey this year, while we did not win any silverware, we have many achievements and memorable moments to celebrate.

On the international stage, the past twelve months have seen our men's teams win a fifth ODI World Cup, claim the Test championship and retain the Ashes (thanks Johnny Bairstow). Our women's team is now one of the biggest sporting brands on the planet and rivalling the reputation the All Blacks previously claimed as the most dominant national team on the planet. The greats of the current game are setting outstanding examples for junior players with impeccable role models such as Alyssa Healy, Ash Gardner, Pat Cummins and Josh Hazelwood.

Junior and Senior Team Highlights

This season, the Club registered 118 junior players, showing the vibrant future that lies ahead for us. This included four Cricket Blast teams and ten junior teams, a testament to the growing interest and participation in cricket within our community.

Our commitment to providing opportunities at every level saw us fielding four senior teams, with 68 players competing in the SSCA Competition. It's a reflection of our club's depth and the passion for cricket that runs deep in our members.

Achievements

A highlight of this season was seeing six of our teams contest the finals series. Our 10B, 10C, and 12D teams showed tremendous spirit and skill to reach the Semi-Finals. Our B3 senior team, alongside the 12B and 10D sides, finished as runners-up, with the 10D team also earning the title of Minor Premiers. These achievements are a direct result of the hard work, dedication, and teamwork displayed by our players and coaches throughout the season.

Representative Success

Our club's talent was recognised on a broader scale, with 19 players selected in representative teams and 29 Dragons juniors playing Sydney Grade Cricket. A special congratulations must go to Luke Ritchie, who made his First-Grade debut for Sutherland. It was only a few short years ago that Luke stood right here and received his Junior Cricketer of the Year award. These are incredible achievements and speak volumes of the level of talent and commitment within our ranks.

SECRETARYS REPORT

This season the Club celebrated its 65th season of cricket in the Sutherland Shire. Since the Clubs establishment in the 1959/60 season, it has provided the opportunity for thousands of cricketers in our local community to play and enjoy this great game of cricket. To mark this milestone the Club, thanks to the efforts of Brad Moreland and Tim Russell were able to provide every player in our Club with a training shirt and shorts. This would not have been possible without the generous support of our sponsors.

Main points of the season –

- The Club had an increase in junior registrations of 2 teams and a status quo in the senior ranks with 4 sides. Most pleasing was the increase in number of our Cricket Blast and U10 players, which goes well for the coming seasons.
- Thank you to all our sponsors, new and old. These sponsors have allowed us to keep registration fees to a minimum, free playing shirts & caps for new players as well as providing other extra benefits like vouchers. The club appreciates each and every one of our sponsors listed on page 3 and ask all members to support them in return.
- The PlayHQ platform after a couple of years of teething problems is now benefitting coaches, managers, scorers and senior captains. We hope this will encourage more volunteers to come forward and take on these roles.
- As noted on pages 4 & 5 the Club has again provided a great number of our ex and current players to representative teams at all levels. This is a tremendous achievement for everyone selected.
- We wish our 13 players listed on page 14, that have just completed their final season of junior cricket and wish them all the best in their future cricket endeavours.
- Although we were not able to win any premierships this season the Club was successful with 6 of our sides flying the Dragon's flag in the final's series. Congratulations to our – Semi-Finalist teams: 10B, 10C & 12D and Runners-Up teams: B3, 12B & 10D (Minor Premiers).
- Over the past twelve months the club has lost two great stalwarts with the passing of Life Member Bob Price and clubman Gerry Dwarshuis. Bob, a club legend devoted over thirty five years of service to our club covering many committee roles. Gerry played both junior and senior cricket for our club as well as managing junior teams during his son's time with the Dragons. They will both be greatly missed.
- I would like to thank our committee who has again worked hard to get our players out on the field, but as of late we have been running on an oily rag in terms of volunteers. The club desperately needs an injection of young parents to step in and shoulder some of the load if we are to be successful going forward.

Thank you to everyone that has played some role this season. Whether it be coach, manager, scorer, senior captain or parent, your help is vital in keeping this club running.

Congratulations to all our players for doing their best while representing our great club and I hope to see you all back again next season with a friend.

TREASURERS REPORT

Hopefully everyone enjoyed their time on the field this season. Congratulations to all those who had a successful year.

During the year the club made an operating loss of \$5,512.19 compared to last season's profit of \$788.87. More benefits were put back to our club members in 2023/24. The overall balances are healthy at \$55,123.01.

Highlights include;

- Cash balances of \$55,123.01 down \$5,512.19 on last season.
- Income was \$27,940.98 due mainly to Registration fees and Advertising/Sponsorship payments.
- Registration Fees were \$13,915.06, this is up from last season's \$13,255.67 due mostly to higher fees charged this year.
- Uniform purchases were slightly higher. The club continued to provide free playing shirts for all new players.
- Sponsorships/Grants for the year were up by \$750.60 to \$13,400 from \$12,649.40 last year.
- Our Expenses were \$33,453.17 up \$5,988.18 compared to last season, mostly due to the supply of the supporter shirts and shorts provided to all Players.
- Umpiring costs were down by \$677 compared to last season, mainly due to the lower number of official umpires.
- Cost of Balls were lower by \$937.80.
- Equipment purchases were up \$2,468.70 to \$4,554.60, mainly due to restocking of some old equipment.
- Uniforms went up \$6,821.65 to \$10,842.70. The increase was due to the purchase of supporter shirts and training shorts.
- Presentation Night costs were down \$1,085.72, however still providing drinks and food on junior/senior presentation nights/day.
- Our Rent and clubroom costs were down \$599.88 compared to last year.
- Other Sundries' costs were higher than last year by \$561.99 to \$3,072.79. Most of the cost reflected new Banners.

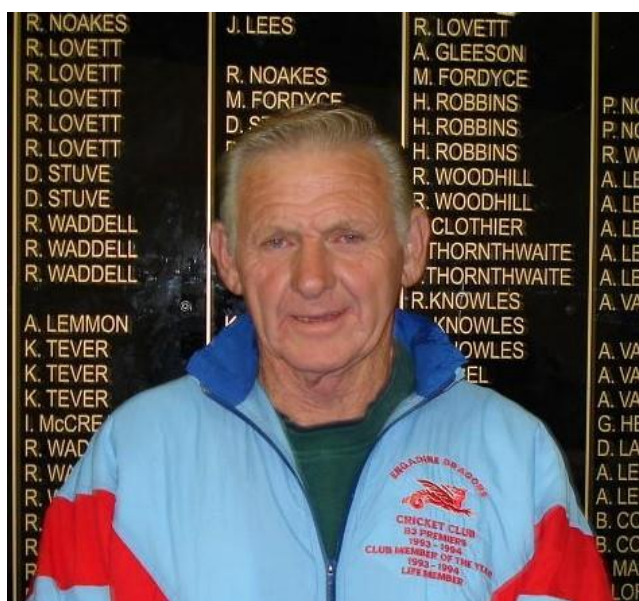

VALE – ROBERT “BOB” PRICE



Our Club sadly reports the loss of Life Member Bob Price who passed away on Thursday June 29, 2023.

Bob was one of the club's old brigade who kept the Engadine Dragons Cricket Club together and afloat during the lean years of the late 1980s and early 1990s.

A true stalwart of the club Bob held down many positions from junior coach to committee member with his major role being publicity officer, a duty he carried out for 24 seasons from 1988/89 to 2011/12. Typing and printing our fortnightly club newsletter as well as our annual reports, firstly on an old Gestetner printer, then wearing out numerous

photo copy machines. You were always likely to find Bob at home in his garage surrounded by mountains of photo copy paper and Engadine Eagles soccer kits.

Bob was also renowned for his fund raising achievement, especially the club raffles and the thousands of dollars in sponsorship that he drew to the club every season. These funds proved invaluable for the Club's finances and assisted towards the construction costs of our club rooms, a project that Bob instigated.

Many of the older members will have fond memories of our monthly Club meetings with Bob and his old mate Bill Knowles trading friendly barbs from the opposite sides of the meeting room. It was like watching a baseline rally between Federer and Nadal.

Bob always supported his two sons Darren and Graham throughout their cricket careers. Both boys have amassed a combined playing service of 54 years with Graham being awarded Life Membership for his playing service.

Bob was always a very quiet and humble man who went about his work without any fuss or fanfare, but his achievements were numerous. Bob was awarded the "Club Sportsman of the Year" trophy in 1992/93 and "Club Person of the Year" in 2005/06, but so easily could have been awarded it every season in between. In 1999 Bob was awarded a Life Membership of the Engadine Dragons Cricket Club with the "Bob Price Encouragement Shield" being named in his honour. He was also awarded the 'Hughes Community Award' in 2006 for his work for both cricket and soccer.

Bob was an absolute champion of a man in the Engadine community who will be solely missed by all, but forgot by none.

Stuart Dibb joined the Engadine Dragons in the 1994/1995 season beginning his love for the club in the under 8's competition. Ray Griffiths, Stuart's 8E coach wrote in his end of season report that Stuart was a future batting star. Ray was a good judge.

In his second season he won his first premiership (photo below). From that season on Stuart made his way quickly into A grade as a talented opening batsman showing a level of patience and determination beyond his years.

Stuart continued through the grades finishing Junior cricket at the conclusion of the 2002/03 season. The following season Stuart began playing in the Seniors competition where he made numerous centuries throughout the following seasons. Stuart captained senior teams and regularly attended club meetings.

Work commitments caused Stuart to move interstate, however this did not stop him playing continuous seasons for the Dragons. A true sign of his dedication to the club is his willingness to return to Sydney and play a couple of games a season.

Stuart has played 25 seasons for the Dragons, although he was not able to play full seasons in his final few years, he fully deserved the honour of Life Membership.

CURRENT JUNIOR CLUB RECORDS – 2018-19 ONWARDS

NOTE: In the season of 1991/92 the junior competition rules were changed as follows: from time limit to an over limit game, with restrictions on individual bowlers, the number of competition rounds were set at ten.

In the younger age groups Introductory and Modified rules were introduced. In 2018/19 junior competition rules were changed by Cricket Australia as follows: the U10 & U12 competitions changed from two day matches to one day matches, the length of the pitch shortened, number of fielders reduced and compulsory retirement at a set number of balls faced by the batsman.

In U14 & U16 competitions matches were limited to one innings per team. Because of these alterations the following EDCC junior club batting, bowling and wicket keeping records have been separated into three eras: 1959/60 to 1990/91, 1991/92 to 2017/18 and 2018/19 onwards.

The senior batting, bowling and wicket keeping records remain unchanged from 1967/68 onwards.

PERPETUAL TROPHIES AND AWARDS CRITERIA *(Amended March 2024)*

GUIDELINES

The Management Committee reserves the right to withhold the allocation of any award where in its assessment of the criteria have not been met or for any other valid reason.

Where the assessment of the award calls for nominations all such nominations must be in writing, with reasons in support. Nominations must be forwarded to be in the hands of the Secretary or Assistant Secretary by no later than two weeks after the date of the final match has been played or any other such date as the Management Committee may announce or publish.

In the absence of nominations, the Management Committee shall consider the merits of each award and may determine a recipient on its knowledge of the available candidates.

The Management Committee may make any special award it sees fit to acknowledge exceptional circumstances or to provide encouragement. The Management Committee may also adjust criteria's from season to season to reflect changed conditions of play.

All considerations of the Management Committee and/or the Executive are confidential. Neither body shall be required to give reasons for the acceptance or rejection of any nomination.

All perpetual trophies remain the property of Engadine Dragons Cricket Club. All perpetual trophies must be returned in good order to the Club Secretary at such date as the Management Committee may announce or publish.

ADMENDMENTS

Due to the implementation of Cricket Australia Junior Cricket Stage 1 in 2018/19 and the subsequent changes to the U10 playing format our Club decided to no longer award U10 "Individual Team Awards". Instead, all U10 players shall be presented with a participation trophy. It was also decided that U10 players will be ineligible to be awarded "Performance Awards" or "Special Club Awards" other than Junior Rookie of the Year. The Club has introduced the "Most Consistent U10 Player" trophy to recognise the most consistent performance by an U10 player. The "Junior Division" has been amended to only represent U12 teams and players, while the "Intermediate Division" remains unchanged and still represents U14 & U16 teams and players.

GENERAL CRITERIA

To provide a measure of objectivity and consistency throughout all levels of the Club for the assessing and determination of awards, the following criteria shall apply when read in conjunction with each award criteria.

- For each 10 runs scored – 1 point
- For each wicket taken – 1.3 points
- For each wicket keeping catch – 1 point
- For each wicket keeping stumping – 1 point
- For each fielding catch – 1 point

Master Blasters and U10 Teams

All Master Blasters and U10 players will be presented with a participation trophy.

INDIVIDUAL TEAM AWARDS

(Personal Trophies)

Junior and Intermediate Divisions

For all U12, U14 and U16 teams engaged in SSJCA competitions there will be three awards presented per team. The awards are - Batting, Bowling and Coaches. For batting and bowling all awards shall be based on the highest aggregates achieved in their graded team. Batting – runs scored and Bowling – wickets taken. These aggregates will be derived from an examination of the Scorebooks and be inclusive of all competition round and semi-finals, but exclusive of the Final.

- In the case of more than one player sharing the highest batting or bowling aggregate the player with the highest average shall be awarded the trophy.
- In the case of one player achieving both the highest batting and bowling aggregate the award shall be determined by using the "General Criteria." The highest calculated points in either batting or bowling shall determine which award is presented. The remaining award either batting or bowling shall be presented to the player with the next highest aggregate.

The Coaches award will be nominated by the Team Management (Coach and Manager).

No one person may be presented with more than one of the above three awards. Please note that joint award winners may be recognised where the Management Committee see fit.

Senior Division

For all teams engaged in SSCA competition cricket there shall be two awards presented per team. The awards are – Batting and Bowling. For batting and bowling all awards shall be based on the highest aggregates achieved in their graded team and derived from an examination of the Scorebooks and be inclusive of first and second innings but exclusive of Finals Series.

- In the event of more than one player sharing the highest batting or bowling aggregate the player with the highest average shall be awarded the trophy.

All team awards shall be based on aggregates achieved in their graded team and derived from the official Scorebooks and be inclusive of first and second innings but exclusive of Finals Series.

In the event of a tied aggregate the award will be determined on average.

Junior/Intermediate Divisions: The greatest number of dismissals will include all catches and stumpings credited to the keeper derived from an examination of the Scorebooks and be inclusive of all competition rounds and semi-final, but exclusive of the Final. In the event of a tied aggregate the award will be determined by the lowest average of byes to dismissals.

(Perpetual trophy and personal trophies awarded)

Senior Division: The greatest number of dismissals will be the aggregate of all fielding catches credited to the fielder derived from an examination of the Scorebooks and be inclusive of first and second innings but exclusive of Finals Series. Junior/Intermediate Divisions: The greatest number of dismissals will be the

aggregate of all fielding catches credited to the fielder derived from an examination of the Scorebooks and be inclusive of all competition rounds and semi-final. but exclusive of the Final. In the event of a tied aggregate the award will be determined on the most catches taken in the least number of matches.

CLUB AWARDS

Most Improved Team

“The Bob Vannan Trophy”

(Perpetual trophy and personal trophy awarded to players, coach & manager)

Determined by the Management Committee and awarded to the team that on results shows improvements in the second half of the season relative to the first half. While the points scored acts as an indicator, the grading and age group of the team will be considered.

Encouragement Shield

“The Bob Price Shield”

(Perpetual shield and personal shield)

Nominations maybe sought and awarded to a player within the Junior and/or Intermediate Divisions. Determined by the Management Committee the award recognises the need to encourage players. Any player may be nominated but the Management Committee will consider age, performance, level at which played, years of experience, commitment, effort, enthusiasm for the game are key determinants. Basically, and as simply as possible, the award is designed to encourage a young cricket to follow his love for the game through playing as long as possible. Generally, a more established player, playing at the higher levels would be seen to be in less need of encouragement than one coming through the levels.

Junior Rookie of the Year

“The Ken Tever Trophy”

(Perpetual trophy and personal trophy)

Determined by the Management Committee in consultation with the team coach and derived from an examination of the Scorebooks and be inclusive of all competition rounds and semi-final, but exclusive of the Final. To be awarded to a player who has competed in their first season of competition cricket and has displayed a high level of skill and ability. There is no weighting for grade. The “General Criteria” set above excluding run outs shall apply to assessing and determining this award.

Senior Rookie of the Year

“The Bill Knowles Trophy”

(Perpetual trophy and personal trophy)

Determined by the Management Committee and derived from an examination of the Scorebooks and be inclusive of all competition rounds including first and second innings, but exclusive of Finals Series. To be awarded to a player who is ineligible for junior cricket and has competed in their first season as a senior cricketer and has displayed a high level of skill and ability. There is no weighting for grade. The “General Criteria” set above shall apply to assessing and determining this award

Most Consistent U10 Player***“EDCC Trophy”***

(Perpetual trophy and personal trophy)

Determined by the Management Committee and derived from an examination of the Scorebooks and be inclusive of all competition rounds and semi-final, but exclusive of the Final. To be awarded to the most consistent U10 player, who through efforts with bat, ball or gloves has proved competitive in the SSJCA U10 competition. The “General Criteria” set above shall apply to assessing and determining this award.

Player of the Week Trophy

(Shared trophy)

The Club will supply each of our Cricket Blast, U10 and U12 teams with a “Player of the Week” trophy to be shared amongst its players throughout the season. The trophy may be accompanied by a sponsor’s certificate or voucher.

EDCC Service Awards

(Memento awarded)

Club Service Awards were introduced in the season of 1996-1997. Service Award acknowledges club playing service and seeks to promote pride in the club. The awards presented in periods of five years – five, ten, fifteen, twenty and at twenty-five years Life Membership may be awarded.

SPECIAL CLUB AWARDS**Intermediate Club All Rounder*****“The Ian Latham Trophy”***

(Perpetual trophy and personal trophy)

Determined by the Management Committee and derived from an examination of the scorebooks and awarded to the most outstanding all-round performance in the Intermediate Division. As a guide the following qualification apply – minimum 150 runs scored and 12 wickets taken or minimum 150 runs scored and 8 wicket/keeping catches/stumpings. In the event of a bowler/wicketkeeper qualifying the standard is set as 150 runs scored and a combination of bowling wickets taken/wicket keeping catches/stumpings equalling a minimum of 12 dismissals. The criteria shall be based on aggregates achieved in their graded team and shall be inclusive of all competition rounds and semi-final, but exclusive of the Final. The “General Criteria” set above shall apply to assessing and determining this award.

Senior Club All Rounder***“The Dean Griffith Trophy”***

(Perpetual trophy and personal trophy)

Determined by the Management Committee and derived from an examination of the scorebooks and awarded to the most outstanding all-round performance in Junior/Intermediate Divisions. As a guide the following qualification apply, minimum of 150 runs scored and 12 wickets taken or minimum 150 runs scored and 12 wicket/keeping catches/stumpings. In the event of a bowler/wicketkeeper qualifying the standard is set as 150 runs scored and a combination of bowling wickets taken/wicket keeping catches/stumpings equalling a minimum of 12 dismissals. A player who represents the club in more than one senior team shall have all efforts credited. All awards shall be based on aggregates and be inclusive of first and second innings, but exclusive of Finals Series. The “General Criteria” set above shall apply to assessing and determining this award.

Club Member of the Year***“The Val Tever Trophy”***

(Perpetual trophy & personal gift)

Nominations are sought in writing and determined by the Management Committee and awarded to a club member who gives freely of his/her time and energies in supporting the Club in its activities. Management Committee members may be nominated in which event the Executive Committee shall determine the recipient.

Junior Club Champion***“The Barry McManus Trophy”***

(Perpetual trophy and personal trophy)

Determined by the Management Committee and derived from an examination of the scorebooks and shall be inclusive of all competition rounds and semi-final, but exclusive of the Final. Awarded to the most outstanding U14 or U16 cricketer through efforts with bat, ball or gloves has proved competitive at the higher levels of the SSJCA Competition. The “General Criteria” set above shall apply to assessing and determining this award.

Senior Club Champion***“The Harry Robbins Trophy”***

(Perpetual trophy and personal trophy)

Determined by the Management Committee and derived from an examination of the scorebooks and shall be inclusive of first and second innings, but exclusive of Finals Series. To be awarded to the most outstanding senior cricketer in the club who through their efforts with bat, ball or gloves has proved competitive at the higher levels of the SSCA Competition. The “General Criteria” set above shall apply to assessing and determining this award.

LIFE MEMBERSHIP**Life Membership**

(Life Membership Badge)

In considering any such nomination the committee will be guided by the Club Constitution, in particular – Membership Part No.2 – 2.7 Life Membership –

(a) A Life member is a club member awarded the honorary title of Life Member for outstanding services to the Club.

(b) There shall be for the purposes of recognising outstanding service two streams of entry to Life Membership, playing service and administrative service.

(c) Consideration for Life Membership may only be exercised when the nominee has given no less than 25 years’ service to the club as Playing Member (as defined in Rule 2.2) or, no less than 10 years’ service to the club as a Committee Member, or some other Club support service of a non-playing nature.

(d) Consideration for Life Membership will be undertaken in the first instance by the Management only upon receipt of a written nomination containing reasons in support. Any club members may make such nomination to any member of the Management Committee.

(e) The Management Committee will examine all such nominations and in exercising absolute discretion accept or reject any nomination. Any decision taken is neither subject to explanation nor appeal.

(f) The Management Committee determines for approval that the nominee is worthy of the honour proposed, shall advise members at the next general monthly meeting. That recommendation shall contain details of the service given by the nominee and justification for the action proposed. Approval being a majority vote.

(g) A Life Member whose award derives from 25 years playing service shall henceforth pay no playing fee to the Club beyond that which the Club will impose to cover costs associated with Association registration, insurance, and any other like matter.

(h) A Life Member shall pay no fees to the Club (with the exception set out above in Rule 2.7(g)) and shall be entitled to vote at any club meeting and receive any special consideration as the Management Committee may determine.

(i) Each life member shall be presented with a suitably designed Life Membership badge.

(j) A Life member is subject to the rules and regulations and Code of Conduct of the Club.
